WELCOME DINNER

During the visitation period, Staff and CDU Trustees had a wonderful time time sharing with one another some of the things the Lord is impressing in our hearts and families (thoughts, gratitude, humility and respect) as they continue to fulfill God's mission ahead of them in the transformation of the vulnerable communities in Uganda. Dinner was always a time of prayer, and getting to know each other in the service of God.





STUDENTS' RETREAT

A large number of students in both primary and secondary schools in Uganda are challenged with several adjustment problems like loneliness and feeling of insecurity, conflict with peers and teachers bad companies and sexual problems which all create emotional tensions and anxiety among the students. WADU recognizes that students in schools



need guidance and Spiritual support on a regular basis a reason why we have taken it upon ourselves to reach out to the students and pray with them at the beginning of each school term.



BATWA EDUCATION

Word and Deed Uganda with support from Christian Development Uganda (a UK-based charity), supported 193 Batwa child in Education and Economic empowerment in partnership with 9 Government Aided primary schools in Kabale and Rubanda Districts in South western Uganda.

Feed My Lambs A SCHOOL MEAL PROGRAM

Batwa School feeding Initiative which was launched in February 2021 has so far been a huge success, with many Batwa children attending school throughout the week and the entire school term. We continue to feed them with both Spiritual and Physical food so that they are able to attend school and again always reflect on the provisions of their Father in Heaven.

THE LIFE CHANGING POWER OF SCHOOL MEALS









WADU School meals continue to support the Batwa children in returning to school. They directly contribute to children's health, nutrition, and education.

WADU believes that No Mutwa child should wonder when they will eat their next meal for an active and healthy school life to help children focus in the classroom.

PROVISION OF A DAILY SCHOOL MEAL

Throughout the school year, the Truckload of food was purchased. Maize Flour, beans, Salt were brought in and broken down into individual bags which could be carried to the different schools. More than just



one day worth of food was given. The idea was to give enough for one meal per day for the whole month and to try and make the rations proportioned for the number of children per school as usual. With generous support from Christian Development Uganda a UK-based Charity,48,829 meals were given to the 193 Batwa children for 253 school days with each child

PROVISION OF KNITTED GIFTS TO HELP CLOTHE THE CHILDREN.

Because the Batwa are always in dirty clothes. they are often despised by the Bakiga counter parts because the type of clothes one puts on determines his social status. A cold mist hovers over most of the Batwa settlements in Rubanda District and the coldness that the children face in the mornings exposes them to running noses throughout the morning hours. The knitted gifts from our friends in the UK therefore came at a time when they were much needed for both the school going children and their young siblings at home too. The jackets, hats and baby blankets were all received with joy and laughter by the children and their mothers. We are highly indebted to a group of women in the UK who found it crucial for the Batwa children to be kept warm during the cold seasons and thought of sending their knitted materials to the children



through Christian Development Uganda.



STAFF HEALTH TRAINING

It was not his mission to turn WADU staff to take on the roles of auxiliary medical staff but because they often come across people who need medical attention in the course of their no-medical missions, Dr. Mike provided a day's training in in the management of nutritional and dental problems, fevers, malaria, anemia, pregnancy complications and acute respiratory infections. He also equipped WADU with first Aid toolkits for the diagnosis of malaria, Anemia and baby weighing scales for children under her care.

COMMUNITY HEALTH CAMP

The living conditions of the Batwa are beyond sad. The fact that they are also going without medical attention is ridiculous. Dr. Mike Dobson who was one the visiting team members observed that the extreme poverty of the lifestyle of the Batwa makes the achievement of basic hygiene virtually impossible. Because of this, he organized a medical mission camp at Kinyarushengye primary school where some identified cases of umbilical hernia, ring worms, jiggers and malnutrition were

identified among the children and referrals made. In addition, the following cases were also identified among the Adults and referral advice given for further medical attention.

- 1. Stomach related pains/complications
- 2. Ulcers
- 3. HIV/ Aids.
- 4. Abnormal menstruation periods







CHILD SPONSORSHIP PROGRAM

In our Child sponsorship program, we balance the physical, social, economic and spiritual care together to help each child fully mature in every aspect of life by providing resources and guidance for the children to complete basic secondary Education and beyond.

We were saddened to hear about the passing on of our beloved sponsorship coordinator Gill Henderson who has been running our sponsorship program for years. We continue to hold her family in our prayers and praying that the good Lord remembers all her good deeds as she occupies an abode of the righteous in the company of our Lord Jesus Christ.

Our scholars program continues to thrive with supported students continuing to excel and move on to the next levels. The support of the sponsors continues to create the future that the children envision for. WADU always provides emotional support, to create a safe place in a dark world that is in the throes of the evil and showing love all to the glory of God.

SCHOOL YEAR IS READY TO KICKOFF!

As the calendar flips to February, it means one thing; the start of school is just around the corner. Where did the Christmas season go? Days are getting shorter and school supplies are on the shelves in all the local shops. The parents and children are always anxious of where the money for tuition fees and other school supplies will come from. To WADU supported students, this is always a time for relaxation and joy because they are always

assured of tuition, scholastic materials and a beginning of term Career guidance session.

BEGINNING OF TERM YOUTH



WADU works very hard to raise intelligent and driven students who will be successful in their respective careers.

As young girls and boys under the mentorship scheme begin to grow and mature, there are many issues that they face as they move to schools in Towns.

The overall goal of the retreat is always to equip the youth with useful and important information so that they have control of their future, health, sexuality and Spiritual life.

All the sponsored children were again so excited to have a retreat and showed great enthusiasm for the purpose of the retreat.

Reflection was from John 31: 15 where the youth were advised to:

- 1. Avoid evil forces that are hindering their success through praying.
- 2. Receive Jesus Christ as their personal savior
- 3. Discover the password that will guide them in whatever they do; following Jesus Christ as personal savior.
- 4. Reduce underage drinking-a common phenomenon among the youth in Uganda today
- 5. Judging whether their future is at stake
- 6. Avoiding Child sexual Exploitation

SERVING WEEKLY NUTRITIOUS PORRIDGE





Because of the baseline surveys and constant Nutrition assessments, Word and Deed Uganda has been feeding 193 Batwa children who were most malnourished by the start of the program. This is done once a month where the kids are fed on hot porridge of maize sova sorghum, wheat and sugar. And

slowly, WADU has watched bloated bellies deflate and eyes reignit



JIGGER TREATMENT

To ensure non recurrence of jiggers, WADU staff continues to sensitise the Batwa children that hygiene of the environment and individual has to be maintained. Regular cleaning of clothing and bedding alter the dirty air conditions and remove the accompanying stench that is conducive to the survival of the jigger. WADU staff continues to do natural extrusion of the egg sac of the jigger with a needle or safety pin to ensure that all the children are completely free from the jigger calamity.



CHILD CENTER DAYS

WADU Ministry approach is holistic in nature, it encompasses man in totality Spiritually, Mentally, Physically and social – economical. In regard to our vision "A Holy Soul in a Healthy mind" children continue to meet at the center every Saturday for a mug of nutritious porridge is served, monthly haircut and health and hygiene assessment as well as Spiritual nourishment

Center days are a demonstration of God's faithfulness and power working through those who love and serve Him wholeheartedly with zeal and commitment. This Providence and Sustainability of reaching out to the lost souls is the reason why WADU remains Evangelical in its Ministries. We continue to thank God for his goodness and also special thanks to all our prayer partners and Donors from the UK.

THE POWER OF PLAY

Play is how the children learn, and how they form a foundation for life in society.

lay is how children explore, discover, fail and succeed, socialize, flourish and thrive.

To WADU and Batwa schools, it has been noticed that as soon as children arrive at a playground, they head directly for the swings and slides with a lot of enthusiasm. Making sure every child in every community can thrive is what we strive for in Word and Deed Uganda.

"The Children are always filled with joy and overcrowd the play equipment every day. Each day is always a fresh start for the children on the play equipment. They are never exhausted or get tired of swinging and sliding. Just a swinging, sliding and





climbing has increased our school enrollment this term" Sadath the Deputy at Rwaburindi primary school explains

The play equipment was designed and by the Chairman Christian installed Development Uganda Mr. Colin Townsend assisted by Mike Peachey and local craftsmen during the recent visit of the CDU Trustees in Kabale. It was installed at Rwaburindi primary









school becoming the second play center after the one installed at Kinyarushengye Primary school by Stanton Harcourt school

COMMISSIONING KINYARUSHENGYE **SPORTS CENTER**

Through play, children take on challenges, they learn faster and they become creative and innovative. Commissioning of the play center at Kinyarushengye primary school was done by the CDU Trustees during their recent visit to Word and Deed Uganda in Kabale Uganda. It was an occasion for the children

and staff of Kinyarushengye Primary school to extend their vote of thanks to the children and staff of Stanton Harcourt School for the fundraising drive towards the purchase and installation of the play equipment at their school. The play equipment From Setting up to Usage of the Play equipment at Rwaburindi Primary School continues to be heavily used and loved by the children during break hours.

ENDING POVERTY

ONE VILLAGE AT A TIME (EPOVAT)

At WADU, we believe in doing one thing and doing it really well. That "one thing" is our Vision of a Holy Soul in a Healthy Body where we believe. "To end poverty we must start with children. Children who grow up in poverty are more likely to be poor when they are adult, perpetuating the intergenerational cycle of poverty,"

With the livestock gifts donated to us through the Alternative giving program, we were able to distribute sheep, rabbits and piglets to different Batwa Households in Kinyarushengye Batwa Centre with the aim of holistically transforming the lives of the Batwa children. The Team usually visits all the beneficiaries and physically check on the livestock. We always encourage the Batwa to keep the animals taking good care of them. We also encourage them to always keep a constant eye on the tethered sheep to avoid sheep strangling themselves with ropes and keeping dry the pens.

From our field visits, we found out that all the

animals distributed in June were still looking good and the Batwa households taking good care of the animals given.

Our staffs also keep constant contact with the families provided with livestock providing them with advice on proper livestock management as well as integrating Nutritional support to the mothers. She always shares with them the joy and possibilities a healthy body can give which is in line with our motto.

LIVESTOCK

FOR NUTRITION IMPROVEMENT

lack of quality soil has made it difficult for Amost families to grow crops among the Batwa resident areas. WADU believes that a sheep produces high-quality manure, which can help a family to improve their crops and bring food security to their community.

Our livestock gifts were provided to 30 families in Kinyarushengye Batwa center where WADU wishes to eliminate hunger and malnutrition in the village by increasing production, access and utilization of nutritious foods, with a special focus on pregnant women, nursing mothers and infants under two.





We were able to distribute sheep, Piglets and Rabbits in our first Alternative giving program aiming at ending poverty one village at a time.

DISASTER

RELIEF SUPPLIES

WADU exercises pastoral care among the Batwa communities in Southwestern Uganda who live in hilly areas along the hedges of Echuya Forest that are prone to disasters.

The April-May heavy rains caused suffering among the already vulnerable groups where lives were lost and houses completely destroyed, several animals killed and crops destroyed. This posed a danger to the Batwa communities to prolonged famine, homelessness and further trouble.

The Batwa finally got some good news and relief because they were among the homeowners who received a replacement tarpaulin shelters and blankets provided by Word and Deed Uganda through its partner UK -based charity -Christian Development Uganda. "This is something God has done. We thank Him and praise Him, "I want you to know that God loves you. Houses can be replaced; animals can be replaced; but lives can't. God sent His Son Jesus Christ to save people. He came to give His life and shed *His blood to save us*". Stephen the Programs and Evangelism Manager assured the Batwa. During the distribution exercise, WADU staff encouraged the Batwa to always integrate the principles of sustainable development into village programs to reverse the loss

of environmental resources and enhance ecosystem services thus reducing on potential floods in the future.

SAVED FROM MORNING COLDNESS

During the May Floods that hit the southwestern part of Uganda, WADU came to the plight of the affected families in Murubindi Batwa center and provided blankets to each of the affected families in the community.

WADU believes that the act of covering someone in crisis is a sign of compassion .These "Blankets" were to provide physical, emotional, and spiritual comfort . We believe that it is that comfort of having something around you that gives you Spiritual and







emotional healing which touches the lives of people who will receive a blanket while enduring a challenging time in their lives.

STRATIFIED EVANGELISM

WADU stratified Evangelism model aims at proclaiming the gospel to every level among the Batwa communities in south western Uganda. We are committed to ensuring that as many Batwa hear the gospel where they are and in a language and through an approach that resonates most with them. The message for the Gospel mission was from Joel 5:25-27; "And I will restore to you the years that the locust hath eaten........And you shall eat in plenty and be satisfied.......





And you shall know that Iam the Lord your God and none else; and my people shall never be ashamed."

HOLIDAY HOME VISITATIONS

When holidays approach in Uganda, most parents tend to keep their children active. Batwa children are also given a number of tasks and household chores to keep them busy at home rather than loitering around other people's gardens. We understand that when children are left un attended to, they end up developing bad behaviours. Therefore the holiday is always an opportunity for Word and Deed Uganda to engage the children in the gospel ministry and encouraging the children to be responsible at attender age by monitoring and visiting their homes to monitor how they get involved in holiday household chores.

Orienting parents on positive parenting

and key family care practices like Hygiene, food security, economic boosters as well as providing guidance and praying with the families were the major activities done during the home visitations to the Batwa families.





PROVISION OF FULL UNIFORM SET

One of our proudest accomplishments is seeing all the Batwa children clad in a full set of school uniform. Many of the schools in Uganda under government care are faced with a number

of problems ranging from limited finances to run the schools due to the poverty of the parents who cannot sustain the students in school in spite of the government intervention of providing free primary education. Due to this, many of the students cannot afford to buy scholastic materials such as uniforms, books, and pencils which make them still fail to attend school. With this in mind Word and

Deed Uganda moved out to look for such schools to support by providing uniforms to the learners. The young boys and girls in all the 9 partner schools got an additional set of uniform including sweaters for warmth in the early morning coldness of Kigezi highlands.

GIRLS' CORNER PROJECT

"ENCOURAGING BATWA GIRLS TO BE STRONG, SMART AND BOLD"

This project was necessitated judging by



the low levels of knowledge on sexual and reproductive health among the Batwa children focusing on four thematic areas of sexuality education, menstrual hygiene management, skills acquisition and positive living. The sexuality education modules focus on values, self-esteem, Goal setting, Assertiveness, relationships and positive living.

HELPING GIRLS TO STAY IN SCHOOL

Batwa girls leaving school early is one of the major challenges NGOs working with the Batwa have been facing .WADU has set up a stay in school program for the Batwa Girls through providing a safe and stable environment with support and guidance from the staff.

WADU staff is encouraging a one -on one tutoring and mentorship scheme for the Batwa girls so that they are able to keep them in school and nurture them into future responsible mothers.



INTERNSHIP PROGRAM FOR COLLEGE STUDENTS

Some of the collection red children who ANNUAL REPORT 2023

are in their last year at the college were able to go for Industrial Training and Internship in their respective fields of study and the good news is that they are both doing well practicing what they have learnt in the college for the past years.





UNDIES FOR HEALTHY LIVING

It was observed that there was an underwear crisis among the Batwa children (both girls and boys) for promotion of key hygiene behaviors at home and at school. Failure to wipe properly their butts also leaves them susceptible to urinary tract infections and

other unhygienic conditions. The undies were thus provided to help the children to stay in school and gain knowledge necessary for a healthy future. Every year a Mutwa child stays at school increases their economic prospects for the rest of their lives.





DISTRIBUTION OF CERAMIC WATER FILTERS

ver 20 million Ugandans have no access to clean water and water borne disease are among the major causes of child mortality in Uganda and especially among the Batwa

who have no access to safe Drinking water. WADU supported students on Tourism and Hospitality during their Internship in June. Word and Deed Uganda is very keen on Health and Sanitation and has been running different health intervention programs like Nutrition assessment, Jigger Treatment, deworming and community health outreach programs. With many partner schools lacking clean drinking water, WADU thought of providing ceramic water filters to each partner school in the 3 Districts of Kabale, Rubanda and Kisoro






in south western Uganda. Ceramic water filters provide affordable high quality drinking water at household and classroom level for communities who are otherwise without access to safe drinking water. The filters were distributed to schools in order to provide the children and their teachers with safe drinking water free from microbes for good health.

PERFECT SCHOOL GIFTS

Word and Deed Uganda received perfect gifts of Colorful LCD Writing Tablets from Christian Development Uganda Trustees to unleash the children's creativity, practice hand writing, maths, alphabet, numbers and drawing.

The Batwa children were able to freely release their natural instincts, enjoying painting, counting numbers, spelling words, among others.

WADU celebrated its Easter with the children from the partner schools where about 4050 children that were reached with gospel of Jesus's death and resurrection. The children were so happy and the different activities took place including skits, word sharing and praising.

The message was from John 14:20 that Jesus' death reconciles us to God and we become one with Him as we also become one with other believers (John 17:11).



Word and Deed Uganda uses the schools monitoring program to deliver key messages and conversations that promote healthy, responsible behaviors among Batwa Girls through the Girls' corner program. The Girls' corner program aims to support the Batwa Girls to reduce the risk of early marriages, un wanted pregnancies, risk of HIV infections and increase social and community support for youth on positive living and above all, Trusting in their Lord and Saviour to overcome youth –related challenges in Uganda.

Phionah and Marion meet the Girls regularly in our school monitoring sessions to talk about different issues affecting the Batwa Girl child education program.

HANDS RESTORING HOPE

Child birth is always a wonderful time for the family and so the expectant mothers always prepare for this but a Mutwa expectant mother who is always running to uncertainty and needs to regain hope .WADU staff during their routine field visits are always supportive to Batwa rural women and their new born babies who are always was wrapped in knitted baby shawls donated to Word and Deed Uganda from Christian Development Uganda in February this year.
